The goal of the Ohio Children of Incarcerated Parents (CIP) Initiative is to support the integration of best practice prevention approaches into Ohio's re-entry system. Through the diffusion of the evidence-based prevention intervention, Creating Lasting Family Connections (CLFC), the initiative aims to increase personal and family strengthening skills among offenders, restored citizens, and affected youth to support a successful transition back to family and community.

Community Implementation

- Over 100 individuals within the Ohio re-entry workforce trained as facilitators
- Implementation happening within various settings
- Evaluation simple and manageable

- Evidence-based impact on children and adults
